The Walk to Emmaus develops Christian disciples and leaders by inspiring, challenging, and equipping active adult church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, workplaces, and communities. It also

benefits less-active members who are seeking to renew a relationship with God, grow spiritually, or discover firmer foundations for their lives. The Walk to Emmaus is an ecumenical program that invites and involves Christians of many different denominations. Have you heard about the Walk? Your church has been blessed to have past participants in the walk. They may be your active committee leaders, your bible study facilitators, your pastor, or your coffee hosts. People who have experienced the Walk tend to want to bring the Love and Grace of Jesus back to their friends and church families. What happens on the Walk? You will enjoy three days of singing, learning, laughing, worshiping, reflecting, praying and participating in small groups. Discussions center around fifteen talks given by laity and clergy. These talks present the theme of God's grace, how that grace comes alive in the Christian community and how it is expressed in the world. You'll also discover how grace is real in your life, how you live a life of grace, and how you bring that grace to others. You will have the opportunity to participate in the daily celebration of Holy Communion and to understand more fully the body of Christ. The walk experience is unique for everyone who attends.

# A Christmas message -- Devine Imagination

In Psalm 8, David looks up at the night sky with wonder.

When I consider your heavens,

the work of your fingers,

the moon and the stars,

which you have set in place,

what is mankind that you are mindful of them,

human beings that you care for them? (v3-4)

My college professor – a former Jesuit, we called him Father Fischer -- showed us 2 sets of ontological proofs for the existence and non-existence of God, all perfect and told us: "There are the limits to our reasoning abilities. If there is a God, what better way to show us that he is God... and we are not."

Both of these men, thousands of years apart had pondered God inspiring similar wonder. In my professor's case, his question was not simply a way to show us our place, but like David, God inspired us to engage our divine imagination -- the spark He placed in us at creation. God wants us to be curious, to look on His work with wonder and He keeps our sense of wonder, our imagination engaged often by upsetting our expectations. But, again, He warns us: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts.

neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. -- Isaiah 55:8

Earlier in Psalm 8, David wrote:

Through the praise of children and infants,

you have established a stronghold against your enemies,

to silence the foe and the avenger. (v2)

What? Infants and Children? Against big, strong enemies? Really?

Exactly. Isaiah predicted it.

For to us a child is born,

to us a son is given,

and the government will be on his shoulders.

And he will be called

Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,

Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Of the greatness of his government and peace

there will be no end. -- Isaiah 9:6-7

In Isaiah's day, sons of kings became kings and hopefully great ones begat even greater kings and that's what Isaiah's prophesy sounds like -- David and Solomon -- rolled into one. And you have to think that's what the Jews of the day expected.

But no. Surprise. A poor kid, born to teenage parents in a barn -- the last and the least -- the kingdom of Heaven, not the kingdoms of Earth. God in human form, destined to ransom Himself to restore our opportunity of real relationship with Him.

Imagine. "what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? (Psalm 8:4) We are blessed. Merry Christmas!

#### **WORDS FOR REFLECTION**

I was recently reading a book for the Academy for Spiritual Formation I am attending. I began reading about how agape love has been seen through the centuries through different theologians' eyes. I was reminded of a friend involved in Emmaus Ministries for many years who said to me, "Unfortunately, in Emmaus, agape has come to mean a trinket, snack, or letter, and not the true love of God it is intended to be."

Martin Luther King Jr., in his address delivered at the General Assembly of the National Council of Churches in December 1957, spoke of the three kinds of love in the Greek New Testament: *eros* – physical love; *philia* – brotherly love; and *agape* – the sacrificial, unconditional love of God. King said: "When we speak of loving those who would oppose us, we refer neither to *eros* or *philia*. We speak of a love which is expressed in the Greek word *agape*. *Agape* means nothing sentimental or basically affectionate. It means understanding, creative, redeeming goodwill for all [people]. It is an overflowing love which seeks nothing in return. It is not set in motion by any quality or function of its object. It is purely spontaneous, unmotivated, groundless, and creative. It is the love of God operating in the human heart. When we rise to love on the agape level, we love [people] not because we like them, not because their attitudes and ways appeal to us, but we love them because God loves them. Here we rise to the position of loving the person who does the evil deed while hating the deed that the person does" (MLK Papers vol. 6, p. 325).

With the rising tide of criticism and disagreement in our world where the common belief is *If you don't think just like me, you must be my enemy*, the oasis of Emmaus Ministries stands as a bulwark of agape love. Living a Fourth Day lifestyle reminds us that we love others not because they are just like us, but because God loves them, and *that* is what matters. Let us all continue to shower the world with agape love, not just during our Emmaus events and not just in the "trinkets, snacks, and letters," but every day and with every person with whom we come into contact.

As MLK, Jr. said on another occasion, "I have a dream!" We too can dream of a day when the world is filled with agape love. This dream can come true when we approach the world in a "spirit of high idealism, cooperation. and charity" and with agape love.

#### MY FOURTH DAY STORY

I attended Protea Emmaus Walk #125 in Gauteng, South Africa in March 2018.

Though I started my journey five years ago, today it still feels like an absolutely new beginning. My life had been tremendously impacted, especially through the Grace talks when I came to understand the bigger picture of what God, Abba Father, has in mind for humankind. I realized that long before I came into being, God was thinking about me. At that point during my Walk, I thought that my only response could be to serve and share



the truth of the gospel with the church on my journey with Christ.

After my Walk, I had a rough time. Because of episodes of low blood sugar, I was unable to serve as I had intended.

Then, as I was praying for healing from Type 1 diabetes, I came across Dr. Henry Wright's teachings on spiritual root causes of diseases, as well as a biblical and medical program, Under Eagles' Wings by Dr. Michelle Strydom. These provided insights on the importance of establishing God's identity in me and declaring to myself what God says about me. That was when my healing started, and I was able to continue my growth in grace, especially through piety and by sharing my journey to better health with others. This experience gave me a passion for lay servants and newly ordained ministers. I tell them that they have lots of choices, but that The Walk to Emmaus is an excellent ministry for persons who want to be equipped and empowered for the work of God.

#### **2024 COVENANT AGREEMENT**

The 2024 Covenant Agreement signing is now in the Ministry Manager application. The Covenant is now being signed electronically through this application. Before you can complete the signing, you will be given the entire Covenant Agreement to read and then verify that you have read it. The electronic means of completing these steps should make it much easier to sign the Covenant Agreement each year.

There are a couple of video tutorials that will be of help to you. These are located under the FAQ button at the bottom of any Ministry Manager page once you have logged in. You can access a video tutorial from last year that explains the process to fill out a Digital Covenant. Since the process hasn't changed, you can use it as a guidance to complete your 2024 Covenant Agreement without being in Ministry Manager.
