Thoughts from the Assistant Community Lay Director

What is the state of affairs with the Fox Valley Walk to Emmaus Community? What's happening?

I spent most of this last weekend (February 16-18) being present and supporting the Conference Room Team Training. God was truly present in a powerful way at the prayerful anointing ceremony for the Team Members on Friday evening. The teams are ready to go.

We can always use more Pilgrims so get those applications in. The deadline is March 18.

The Board of Directors has essentially completed its work for the 2024 Walks. At the March Board meeting, we start planning for the Walks in 2025. Yes, the process starts one year in advance.

The basic purpose of the Board is to plan and put all the pieces together for the Walks. And there are a lot of pieces that have to come together in a timely fashion if the Walks are to happen. I think I can safely say that without a hard-working functional Board the Walks will not happen.

That brings me to the next activity of the Board and *this is a serious concern*. Can we find enough individuals who are willing to do the work that it takes to put together the 2025 Walks?

The FVWTE By-Laws has a list of 17 individuals that are assigned specific tasks (i.e. Agape, Facilities, Team Selection, Music, Gatherings, Sponsorship and more) for a functioning community. This list is 24 pages long and is modeled after lists prepared by The Upper Room, the organization that oversees the Walk to Emmaus worldwide.

This last year the Board had only 14 individuals and several of the members double and triple tasked.

For the 2024-2025 year, there will be only 7 Board members that are going to carry over.

We need 10 individuals from the community to step up and say I am willing to be a member of the board and do whatever it takes to hold walks in 2025.

We have over 600 individuals that have completed a Walk with FVWTE and are receiving this newsletter. Are there not 10 who are reading this and are willing to step out of the boat and do what has to be done to hold walks in 2025?

Greetings from Fox Valley Walk to Emmaus

The Walk to Emmaus develops Christian disciples and leaders by inspiring, challenging, and equipping active adult church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, workplaces, and communities. It also benefits less-active members who are seeking to renew a relationship with God, grow spiritually, or discover firmer foundations for their lives. The Walk to Emmaus is an ecumenical program that invites and involves Christians of many different denominations. Have you heard about the Walk? Your church has been blessed to have past participants in the walk. They may be your active committee leaders, your bible study facilitators, your pastor, or your coffee hosts. People who have experienced the Walk tend to want to bring the Love and Grace of Jesus back to their friends and church families. What happens on the Walk? You will enjoy three days of singing, learning, laughing, worshiping, reflecting, praying and participating in small groups. Discussions center around fifteen talks given by laity and clergy. These talks present the theme of God's grace, how that grace comes alive in the Christian community and how it is expressed in the world. You'll also discover how grace is real in your life, how you live a life of grace, and how you bring that grace to others. You will have the opportunity to participate in the daily celebration of Holy Communion and to understand more fully the body of Christ. The walk experience is unique for everyone who attends.

When is the next Walk to Emmaus? Our Spring Walks are at Camp Fairwood in Westfield, WI. The 2024 Men's Walk is April 18 – 21 and the 2024 Women's Walk is April 25 – 28. MY FOURTH DAY STORY by Susie Gilley

I had my Walk to Emmaus experience with the Chattanooga-Lafayette Community in 1993. At the time, I was raising a small child who had been diagnosed with a rare type of cancer at birth. So, my Walk found me in a state of shock and tiredness from much traveling to and from the hospital that was 7 hours away. I loved my Walk, but for obvious reasons, I wasn't able to take it all in at the time. However, it gave me hope as I embarked on my Fourth Day.



Over the years I have been on various event teams, but an event I attended 5 years ago impacted me the most. Previously, whenever I was invited to be on a team, it was always during a low time in my life, and I really needed it. This particular time I

was excited to be a table leader again, but then again I wasn't. I prayed to God to send me participants who weren't needy or had other problems. But we all know how that goes—be careful what you ask for.

2024 COVENANT AGREEMENT for FVWTE Board Members

The 2024 Covenant Agreement signing is now in the Ministry Manager application. The Covenant is now being signed electronically through this application. Before you can complete the signing, you will be given the entire Covenant Agreement to read and then verify that you have read it. The electronic means of completing these steps should make it much easier to sign the Covenant Agreement this year.

There are a couple of video tutorials that will help you. These are located under the FAQ button at the bottom of any Ministry Manager page once you have logged in. You can access a video tutorial from last year that explains the process of filling out a Digital Covenant. Since the process hasn't changed, you can use it as a guide to complete your 2024 Covenant Agreement without being in Ministry Manager.

reflect on ways in which, as followers of Christ, they can contribute to the building of a more just society


